

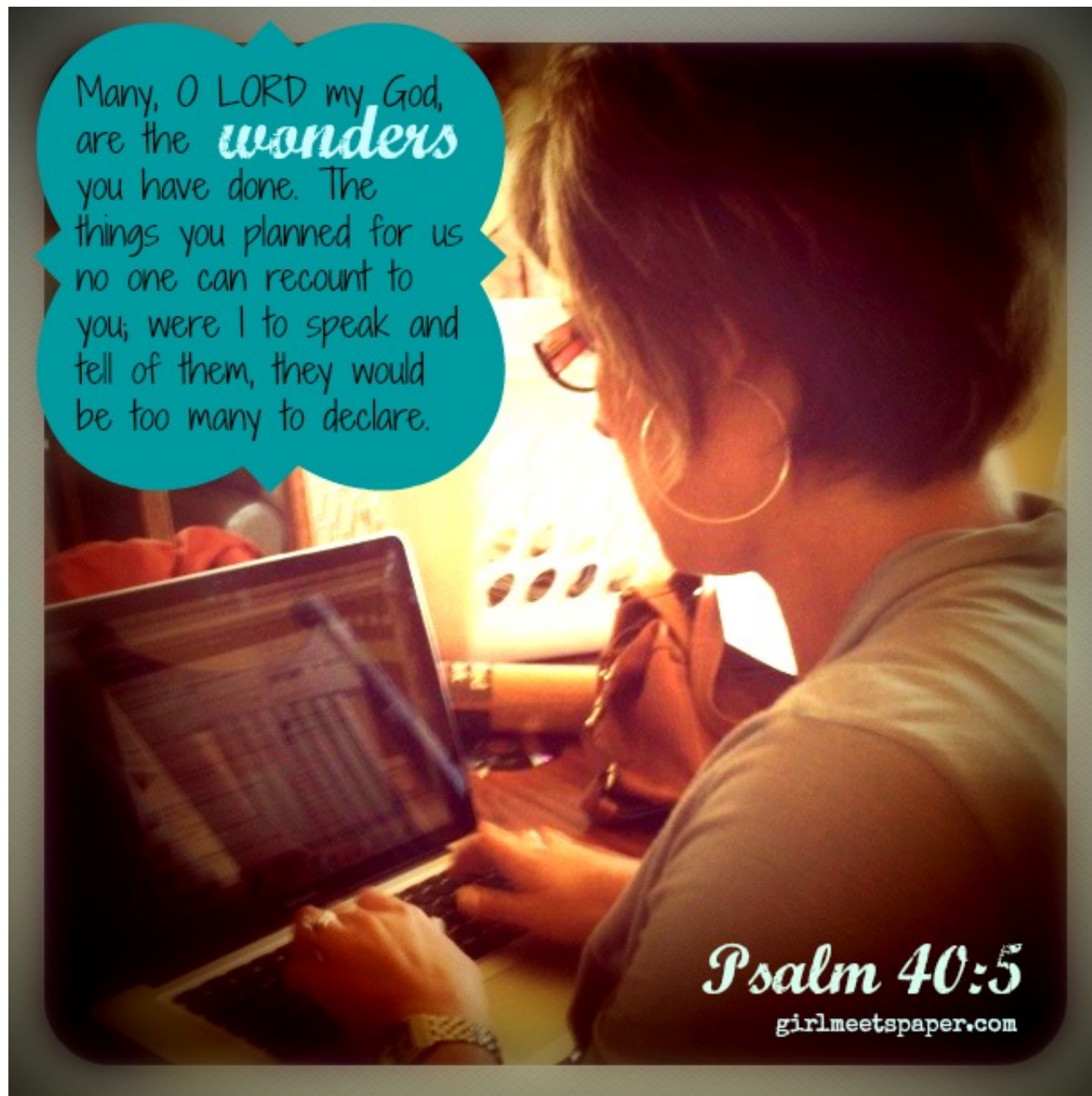
Monday Morning Meditation: Psalm 40:5
